III) Share on Banks Statements standardisation

Achieved, continuation of this point will be integrated in the previous one.

IV) Link between ESEF and banks/insurance

Confirmed as ESEF starts in 2021.

V) Extend contacts with industry members and representatives

Confirmed.

The audit letter taxonomy (standard banking statements) has been finalized. It has been set live on www.bankingtaxonomies.org. ING will set up a pilot in the UK to test the implementation with customers and accountants.

[POC DISCUSSION]

As proposed by Sebastian, it appears more efficient to first separate the POC into 2 different topics:

- Deal with big volumes of data, test efficiency, try XBRL-CSV, prove XBRL can be an efficient technology for both granular and aggregated data;
- Identify key indicators in Anacredit, SHS, FINREP, link with BIRD, prove a business minded taxonomy would help to analyse data with XBRL.

Once solved separately, it will be easier to join the efforts in a complete solution.

As decided in the meeting, the next steps for the BI WG and its POC are:

- TO PREPARE FOR OUR NEXT MEETING -

- Vincent has obtained access to high volumes of (anonymized) Anacredit data
- Software editors (Fujitsu, Invoke, Corefiling in the room) will work on the high volume tests
- Other participants (Kaoutar, Gina, Katerina, Olena in the room) will review the POC perimeter and link with BIRD
