Q1: Do you agree that the digital Draft ESRS Set 1 XBRL Taxonomy adequately represents the ESRS disclosure requirements?

Yes/No

We agree that the digital Draft ESRS Set 1 XBRL Taxonomy adequately represents the ESRS disclosure requirements In addition, there are a number of aspects on which we feel that the Taxonomy does not represent some information that is given in the standards to the best extent possible.

#### 1.Representation of the shall/may distinction in the standards:

The standards make a difference between data an undertaking shall disclose when a topic is material, and suggestions of data that an undertaking may disclose. The taxonomy includes elements for both data points, which is appropriate. However, there is no clear difference shown in the taxonomy between these two types of data points. It would be very useful for both users and issuers to be able to differentiate elements by using this characteristic.

Such a difference could be achieved by using different reference arcroles, for instance.

#### 2. Representation of data points that are often integers:

The taxonomy created elements as integers where the standard does not explicitly require integers. As figures may be reported as averages (for instance, the number of hours of training), using this type will create trouble. Given the elements in question, we see little disadvantage to creating them using the decimal type instead.

#### 3. Representation of metadata about specific data points:

Besides the basic attributes (metric, dates, value), there are important aspects of information that the ESRS highlight, that do not seem to be reliably modelled in the taxonomy.

Q1: Do you agree that the Draft Article 8 XBRL Taxonomy adequately represents the Article 8 disclosure requirements?

The Draft Article 8 XBRL Taxonomy closely mirrors the Article 8 disclosure requirements. While it effectively facilitates data collection, further enhancements are needed to fully optimize its digitalization capabilities in taxonomy development. We recommend the following improvements to be considered when implementing the final taxonomy:

1.We would like to recommend 2 recommendations to capture the information related to KPIs

ESRS and Article 8 taxonomy consultation response cover letter

Dear Patrick, Chiara and Hans,

We write on behalf of XBRL Europe and XBRL International in connection with EFRAG's taxonomy consultations relating to ESRSs and Article 8, both of which will be necessary ingredients for the implementation of legislation and rules for the digitisation of the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD).

We were delighted when IXBRL technology was selected by the European Commission for the European Single Electronic Format Regulatory Technical Standard (ESEF RTS) and for the CSRDdriven amendments to the ESEF RTS that extend the digilisation requirements to include sustainability information. IXBRL enables reporting entities and users to unlock the value of business data and benefit from transparent high quality information on a timely basis.

We support the proposed taxonomies. We recommend that these are finalised without undue delay

- the necessary and subsequent rulemaking process can be completed with measured urgency; and
- a data-centric approach to devising human readable CSRD disclosures can be adopted by reporting entities as soon as practical.

Education and dialogue will be important ingredients for successful implementation of these taxonomies and the XBRL community is willing to have an active role in these efforts. Relevant insights and experience have been gained during the implementation of ESEF that have direct relevance. We ask that ESMA continue to play a central role in the ongoing dialogue and education processes around the topic of digitising CSRD. Our organisations stand ready and prepared to do the same.

We recognise that devising taxonomies in a situation where law and standards have been finalised, but reporting practice is not yet established is particularly difficult. We commend the efforts of the EFRAG team to bring the disclosure requirements into a digital format. It does need to be recognised that emerging approaches to sustainability disclosures will need to be reflected in future iterations of these taxonomies and we encourage EFRAG to be alert to how reporting entities are choosing to disclose information in practice and review the taxonomies on a timely basis once common reporting practices emerge.



No regular meeting were initially planned in 2023 for the Bank & Insurance WG.

However, considering the developments on DPM, the decision has been taken in February 2023 to form 2 subgroups:

- to prepare a letter to the authorities
- to define a roadmap to improve the standard (Formulas mainly)

The second subgroup has been transformed into a specific Standard Roadmap WG.

The further evolutions have lead to reactive more regular meetings for the Bank & Insurance WG.

For FY2024 Budget revenue is in slight decrease due to the resignation of some members even if new members like ECB joined us (35 members in 2024, compared to 38 in 2023). It is also due to a slighly less profitable sponsorship scheme at the 32nd XBRL Europe in Malta as of the time of the preparation of this FY2024 Budget.

Expenses of FY 2024 Budget (181.800  $\in$ ) are quite constant to be compared to Actuals 2022 (182.338  $\in$ ) . And they include a 10.000  $\in$  budget for Consultant Fees budgeted for the New CEO to be selected for Q3/Q4 2024), travel expenses for 10.000  $\in$  and conference expenses for 12.000  $\in$ . All that leading to a slight deficit of (-1.000  $\in$ ) for FY2024 Budget.
